Algebra 2 is a traditional course that reinforces the skills of Algebra 1 by more extensive work in factoring, solving linear equations, fractions and real numbers. The concepts of square roots, cube roots and fourth roots will be covered. We will introduce and develop solutions for quadratic equations. Functions, systems of equations and inequalities will also be reinforced and practiced in this course.

RESPONSIBILITIES: You must bring your iPad and pencil to class every day. It is essential that you take notes. These notes will contain examples that will help and guide you to having success in your problem-solving skills to complete homework, quizzes or tests. We will use the iPad for Canvas, IXL, possible calculator, whiteboard practice and possible research. You will also turn in some assignments via Canvas. This is a math class———my goal is to help you become a successful math student. In order to do so we must PRACTICE, PRACTICE! Therefore, I am asking you to TRY, TAKE NOTES and give the BEST EFFORT that you are capable of giving. My contact information is on the front of this paper so ask me for any help that you may need.

GRADING: Any work that we do in class is fair game for grading. In general, you will NOT have homework and you are expected to finish the day's work in class. I want you to have in-person help because it's a good place to ask questions to help you understand the material. Quizzes and tests will **usually** be given on Fridays (20 – 40 points for a quiz, approximately 50-60 for a test). I attempt to teach one or two topics per week then wrap them up on Friday with an assessment. (quiz or test). If you are absent the work will be available to you on Canvas.
