#### Course Description

This course is a two semester survey of American History from the Colonial Period to the Present. Students may earn up to six college credits by taking and passing the College Board A.P. examination. The course correlates the past with the present. Students will be able to explain "why" or "how" historical events evolved rather than simply "what" happened. A strong emphasis on essay writing and projects will be maintained throughout the year. Lastly, this course is equivalent to a introductory college level course. Students will be expected to go above and beyond simple textbook knowledge by examining factual matter, using logic and analysis to evaluate historical evidence, interpreting maps and charts, extensive reading of primary and secondary works, and providing evidence of learning with essay type examinations.

The primary text for this course is America: Past and Present Eighth Edition by Robert Divind et al.
